

**GRAVEL ROAD PETITION,
TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COM-
MISSIONERS OF VERMILION COUNTY, IN-
DIANA;—**

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent to your honorable body that they and each of them are resident free-holders and free-holders and voters of Clinton Township, Vermillion County, Indiana and that there is no incorporated town or city in said township containing thirty thousand inhabitants, and said petitioners petition your honorable body to improve and cause to be improved by proper draining, grading and paving with stone, gravel or other road paving material, the following highway in Clinton Township:

Commencing near Centenary Church at the point which is the center of section thirteen, township fourteen north of range ten West, running thence East, following the course of the present roadway, about two and one fourth miles, more or less, to a point which is at or about the Southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of section seventeen, township fourteen North of range nine West, thence in a Southeasterly direction, on present roadway, to the North line of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of section sixteen in said township and range, thence East on said North line to where said line intersects the Hazel Bluff and Clinton Free Gravel Road, said proposed road being in all two and three fourths miles, more or less, in length, and lying wholly within Clinton Township, Vermillion County, Indiana.

And your petitioners further ask that on the presenting of this petition that your honorable body will appoint a competent Civil engineer and two viewers, each of whom shall be a responsible freeholder and voter of said county, not a resident of, nor taxpayer, nor owner of taxable property in said township, to make all needful surveys of said road, determining whether such improvements shall be of public utility, the width of such highway, not less than thirty-six feet, the character of the improvements, including grading, draining, paving, together with complete plans and specifications of said improvements, and all other requirements therein, and estimate the cost of each improvement to be made, and after all things have been found to be regular in conformity to law, with reference to the above requirements, that said highway be ordered made without submitting the matter to the voters of said township, for which your petitioners pray.
