## **GRAVEL ROAD PETITION**

## Petition in Helt Township

Notice is hereby given that a petition of which the following is a true copy, towit:

## PETITION

State of Indiana, Vermillion Coun-

To the honorable Board of Commissioners, of the County of Vermillion and State of Indiana.

The undersigned petitioners show to your Honorable Board that this petition is signed by at least fifty freeholders and voters of Helt Township, Vermillion County, Indiana. That there is an existing public highway in said Township described as

Beginning at 'he northwest corner of section Thirty-four (34), Township Fifteen (15) north of range ten (10) west and run thence south along the west side of said section Thirty-fcur (34), one mile more or less to the township line dividing Clinton and Helt townships.

Your petitioners respectfully petition that said highway be improved by grading, draining and paving same with gravel as follows, towit:

That said highway should be opened and improved to the width of 36 to 40 feet.

That the grade thereof be constructed to the width of 24 feet, that there should be placed thereon 6 cubic yards of good, clean, sharp gravel to each lineal rod thereof. That said gravel be placed between boards nine feet apart, and that said boards be thirteen inches high, and the gravel to be twelve inches deep in center, and he placed thereon so as to form a uniform curve from the top edges of said boards to the center of the roadbed.

That all necessary drains and side drains, bridges and culverts and sewer tile therein be so constructed as to make said gravel road a complete gravel road.

Said petitioners further show that said Helt Township has incorporated town within it which is of less than thirty thousand inhabitants; and that there is no town or city within said Helt Township that has as great a population as thirty thousand inhabitants.

Said petitioners further show that the said road will be of public utility and that it will be of public utility to drain, grade and pave the same, as herein set out, in the width and manner herein set out, and that the cost thereof will be less than the Miller & Pike, Atty. for Petitioners.

Notice of Presentation of Gravel Road benefits thereto; and that said road will not pass into or through any incorporated city or town.

Said petitioners also show that said road does not exceed three miles in length, and is, towit one mile, more or less, in length, and connects with a free gravel road at the north end that runs west through the town of Jones, and at the south end with a free gravel road known as the Brouilette's Creek road.

And your petitioners pray for the location and improvement of said highway, in all things in accordance with Section 62 and 83 inclusive of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1905, entitled, "An Act Concerning Highways," and all Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto.

For all of which they pray.
