

PETITION.

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Vermillion County:—

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent to your honorable body that they and each of them are resident freeholders and voters of Clinton Township, Vermillion County, Indiana, and that there is no incorporated town or city in said township containing thirty thousand inhabitants. And your petitioners petition your honorable body to improve and cause to be improved by the proper draining, grading, and paving with stone gravel or other road paving materials the following highway less than three (3) miles in length, and which connects at either end with a free gravel road, to-wit:—Commencing at the northern terminus of the Libertyville Free gravel road at the south east corner of section twenty-eight (28), township fourteen (14) north, range ten (10) west, and run thence north and in a northerly direction about one mile to, where said highway intersects with the free gravel road running from the south east corner of the north east quarter (1-4) of section twenty seven (27) township fourteen (14) north, range ten (10) west in a north westerly direction and a terminating in the Indiana Furnace and State Line Free gravel road, said highway to be known as the Coal Creek Free Gravel road, and the direction being intended to follow the center of said highway or as near there to as practicable, but allowing the engineer and viewers of said road to make such changes as will best serve the interests of the public, and make a better road than would otherwise be on the route as now traveled. It is recommended that said highway be established at not less than forty feet in width.

And your petitioners herein further ask that on the presentation of this petition that your honorable body will appoint a competent civil engineer and two viewers each of whom shall be responsible freeholder and voter of said county and not a resident of nor taxpayer nor the owner of taxable property in said Clinton township, to made all needful surveys

veys of such road, determining whether said improvements shall be of public utility, the width of such highway, and the character of the improvements, including grading, draining and paving, together with complete plans and specifications of said improvements, and all bridges and waterways, required therein and estimate the cost of each improvement to be made, and that after all things are found to be regular and to the above requirements and in conformity to law, that said highway will be ordered made without submitting the matter to the voter of said township, and your petitioners will even pray.
